



# OAK SPRING EARLY CAREER FELLOWSHIP

## THE STACY LLOYD III FELLOWSHIP FOR BIBLIOGRAPHIC STUDY

In 2019, the Oak Spring Garden Foundation will award one Stacy Lloyd III Fellowship for Bibliographic Study of \$10,000. The aim of the program is to support an outstanding early-career scholar, working in some area related to plants, gardens and landscapes, who wishes to further his/her career through a dedicated period of focused activity on their scholarly research. In addition to the \$10,000 award, we will also provide access to the Oak Spring Garden Library Collection to support the awardee's research. The 2019 Fellow will be required to work on-site at Oak Spring for two weeks at a mutually agreed-upon time. ### Eligibility

- ❖ Available to an early-career scholar who is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. Applicants must also be a current candidate for a degree or have graduated within the last five years, and currently be engaged in research that would be facilitated by access to the Oak Spring Garden Library collection. The awardee must be available to spend two weeks before the end of 2019 at the Oak Spring estate in Upperville, Virginia where accommodation will be provided free of charge.

### Application Process

- ❖ To begin your application, complete the [Lloyd III Fellowship Eligibility Questionnaire here](#). If you are eligible, you will be prompted to register for the OSGF Applicant Portal, where you will complete your application. You will be prompted to submit:

- i) a resume/curriculum vitae,
- ii) a short description of how the Oak Spring Garden Library collection is related to and will contribute to your research,
- iii) any and all relevant links/uploads to/of writing samples/research outputs, and
- iv) a travel budget of up to \$1,000 for travel to/from the Oak Spring Estate.

Applicants are expected to show exceptional promise, excellence in research, and good communication skills. You may encounter errors in creating an application profile if you use Safari as your web browser. ### Selection Process

- ❖ The awardee will be selected by a panel of three distinguished administrators, scholars, or practitioners with experience and/or knowledge in the field.

### Other Information

- ❖ Travel arrangements of up to \$1,000 will be funded on a reimbursement basis. Accommodations (including boarding and meals) will be provided on-site for a minimum of 14 days and up to two months.
